Trial results being presented at Diabetes UK Conference in Glasgow (7-9 March 2012).

We are delighted to report that the results of our first trial evaluating an electronic Oral Glucose Tolerance Test Kit, have been accepted for presentation at the upcoming national Diabetes UK meeting. A summary of the results will be added to our website shortly after the conference.

First patient randomised into the 'Aspirin Dosing' (ASP) Study on 13th January 2012

ASPIRIN DOSING STUDY - A brief overview

This study is looking to assess whether the potentially protective effects of one tablet a day of aspirin are increased by taking two tablets once a day or one tablet twice a day. Specifically, it will assess whether the clotting activity in the blood of patients with type 2 diabetes can be lowered more effectively, which could play a role in reducing future heart disease in these individuals


UPCOMING RESEARCH

The next study being submitted for ethical approval is the 'HOMA Calibration Study.

This study aims to update a widely used mathematical model that was developed in Oxford. It provides estimates of insulin production and loss of insulin sensitivity. It is hoped that in future this information will help guide the selection of the most appropriate treatments for individual patients with diabetes. This study will require 50 healthy volunteers who do not have diabetes. anticipate commencing recruitment this summer.
